Dr. Abbey Bain - Vice Chancellor for Enrollment and Student Engagement at LSUA.

With her work at LSUA, Abbey is fully committed to fostering a positive and inclusive learning environment, ensuring all 5,104 students feel valued and supported. One of her nominators shared that "While many people are committed to their job, very few have the infectious enthusiasm she possesses." That commitment and enthusiasm bleeds into her passion for CenLA. She is an advocate for professional development and empowerment, especially for women, in the central Louisiana



business community through her various volunteer and board member positions. As a young leader in the academic realm, it's unusual for someone of Abbey's age to be in a Vice Chancellor position, however, her age has not stopped her from being recognized as a state-wide benchmark of success within the LSU system and beyond. She has had a transformative impact on LSUA and, by extension, the state of Louisiana. Her leadership, student-centric approach, and initiatives have propelled the university to new heights, ensuring a brighter future for its students and the area as a whole. Dr. Erin Stokes - Superintendent of Grant Parish Schools

Dr. Stokes has had an impact on the lives of students, parents, teachers, and administrators in Rapides and Grant parishes. Her collaboration with organizations like the United Way, CLTCC, the Sheriff's Office and the Strong Neighborhood Project Team, turned the schools under her leadership into a place of hope and education for families.
